





Charcoal Production Course



5th May 2012. 9am – 5pm. Hensons Wood, Rackenford, Tiverton, Devon. EX16 8DW.

Over a day you will learn to unload the kiln, grade and bag the charcoal, how to reload the kiln and light it. During the day we will monitor and control the burn using a smaller kiln and identify the signs that the burn is complete. You will also spend time exploring the woods, discussing sustainable harvesting of wood for charcoal production, marketing and packaging charcoal and other aspects of charcoal making.

By the end of the course you will have learnt how to make charcoal in a metal ring kiln, have a good overview of charcoal production and have a bag of charcoal for your own barbecue.
